It continues to frustrate us and no doubt some of you have shared in our technical hiccups. But please be patient - we're working on it. Our IT man has been kept busy in his private time, especially when during the intense heat (46.8 C) one of the computer's power pack burned out and another time the motherboard.

By the way, we're holding on to our current email address but our new telephone number is as advised in December (02) 8014 6485. What's happening? Right now, Terry is following a very busy schedule in Western Australia, visiting most of the jails and conducting what will probably be our largest seminar to date. But fairly soon after his return to NSW, he will be off to PNG to do the groundwork at the Buimo Prison in Lae. Bibles from Australia and lesson materials from America are in transit. All should be ready to commence from the beginning of March. Financially! December's income was on par with budget \$ 9588 just ahead of expenses \$9100. We also received another donation of \$5000 to boost our Special Fund to employ chaplain Japhlet in the Rove Prison and to courier the lessons to and fro between Sydney and Honiara. January was a little concerning with income down to \$4236 which is way below our *expenses of \$9246.* We hope that reading this will encourage you to take up a regular sponsorship or a one off donation necessary to keep CBI financially afloat. We may have missed out on letters as well as emails. So please would those who have been asked, resend their scores once again. Thank you so much for this extra trouble. With so **many** new Instructors coming on board and perhaps some 'older' Instructors needing a refresher, I would like to give you an easy and proper way to record your scores to us. Please help us with this simple procedure. This time I would like to say **a huge**

thank you to all the Chaplains and also the Sentencing Boards, who are so helpful with giving information of the changes the inmates have made within the prison system. This has indirectly resulted in a large increase for the Australian lessons last year. In 2012 we had 662 more lessons. In 2011 we had 1814 lessons and in 2012 we had 2476 lessons in Australia. From America we heard that CBI Kenva and Cistern Prison Ministry hosted a walk in support of the ministries' re-entry program, 3500 Kenvans marched with banners and placards. Cynthia, CBI's Deputy Director for international Development made a visit to Sierra Leone, where CBI's newest satellite campus was launched to reach incarcerated teens. Greetings Friends,

A happy new year to you as I look forward to serving our Lord in this wonderful ministry.

As I reflect on 2012, I met some of the most amazing and also diverse people and students of CBI. At a certain Sydney Prison I sat next to a man in a Chapel service who society tells me is bad and will never change. The man I sat next to is now a child of God, he has put his trust in our Lord Jesus. He is a student of CBI and leads a prayer meeting in his pod each morning with other believing inmates. This in itself is quite remarkable because of the ongoing threats of violence from men of another faith.

At a Qld Prison I met one of Australia's most notorious prisoners. This man escaped from custody and sent postcards from the towns he was in to the pursuing police. This man truly is saved and has an amazing relationship with our Lord. But I reflect on our students, who with no fuss eagerly do their studies and then even more so wait for your letters to come back to them. Friends, after 5 years of being your Fieldworker, our students continue to amaze and inspire me. Stories that are repeated over and over again of childhoods with loveless and predominately fatherless upbringings. Stories how these men fled from God, but God in His mercy pursued them even to the darkest of places and met them. I do get inspired by these stories because these men and women truly are the bravest people I

will ever meet because they surrendered to God and want to change. Please continue to pray for our students.

During December I had visits to the following prisons - Woodford CC (Brisbane, Old) on the 2^{nd} , Nowra CC (NSW) on the 8th & 9th, Bathurst CC (NSW) on the 10th, Oberon CC (NSW) on the 11th, Glen Innes CC (NSW) on the 12th, Kempsey CC (NSW) on the 15th, Wolston CC (Brisbane, Qld) on the 18^{th} , Grafton CC (NSW) on the 23^{rd} and in January, Capricornia CC (Rockhampton, Qld) on the 6th of January. My sincere appreciation to all the Chaplains involved in my visits. A special thank you this month to Chaplain Brian for my access to Woodford CC. This was a first time visit to this maximum security facility. Also this month David from Panania in Sydney was trained as an Instructor on the 7^{th} of December and we welcome him to the ministry. During 2012 I had 94 prison visits, 14 church visitations, there were 19 separate Instructor training sessions and 12 functions that I spoke at or attended on behalf of CBI. Finally, a reminder to our Western

Australia Instructors and supporters of the upcoming seminar on the 9th of February at the **Gosnells CRC**. If you are intending to come to the seminar please let me know as soon as possible.
