Well what a shock to the system, this thing they call incarceration, The introduction to it is like landing on another planet or something.

You are told to strip because we want to search you for anything you're not supposed to have. (drugs, weapons, alcohol etc.).

The actual list seems to never end.

Then of course suddenly, (after showering and a meal) you realize you gotta live in this very confined space with some total stranger. He may simply not like the look of your face or something and you gotta get around like you're walking on eggshells, just to keep the peace and adjust to the fact that this is simply how it is:

For Now!

After a period of time you get used to the regimentation of every day life on the inside. Plus the fact that at times you've gotta watch your back, and of course you can't just leave when you are fed up with this forced learning curve/adventure.

Then when you're getting closer to having done your time/sentence, you're moved to a considerably easier going place.

Still stuck being a prisoner of course, but a bit more **proactive**, **positive** and constructive.

So you learn to build plans for when you get out, to be sure you won't be coming back.

In the end YOU choose to be idle and gain nothing, or gain any education you can and qualifications to enhance your lot in life, to be at least an improved version of yourself.

Regardless, I would not recommend anyone becoming a prisoner! It truly is a heavy burden and as I have personally witnessed: For some it was too much to bear.
