Prime-Time series

Each course in the Prime-Time Bible Study series offers 6 sessions of Bible study aimed primarily at high school students, though it also appropriate for recent high-school graduates.

The textbook is the Bible itself, usually studied on a chapter-by-chapter basis and carefully exegeted in the Reformed/Presbyterian tradition. Teaching/learning methods are varied and appealing, encouraging group members to work cooperatively or individually to discover for themselves the richness of a given passage and book.

Prime-Time Bible Studies include a thorough leader's guide and a book of perforated handouts for each group member.


1001 Persian Nights

dence operating - without miraculous mean - in the day-to-day lives of his people to bring about their salvation.




Light at the End of the Tunnel




Dare to Care




Stones, Thrones, and a Valley of Bones




