Keynote Speakers

Michael Goheen

We are privileged to have as one of our keynote speakers this year, **Michael Goheen**. Ordained in the Christian Reformed Churches of North America, Michael Goheen is Jake and Betsy Tuls Professor of



Missiology, Calvin Theological Seminary, Grand Rapids, MI, Professor of Missional Theology, Newbigin House of Studies, San Francisco, CA, and Scholar-in-Residence for the Surge Network of Churches, Phoenix, AZ. He continues to live in Vancouver, BC, and travels a fair bit teaching in California, Michigan, and Arizona. He is married to Marnie for 34 years and is father of four married children and grandfather of five. Among his many books are *The Drama of Scripture: Finding Our Place in the Biblical Story* (Baker, 2004), and *A Light to the Nations: The Missional Church in the Biblical Story* (Baker, 2010). Michael began ministry as a church planter and has continued to be a preaching pastor for the past 13 years in addition to his teaching and writing.

Glanville. They live in Burnaby,
B.C. at present but Mark has lived most of his life in Sydney,
Australia. Mark Glanville works as pastor at Willoughby Christian

is studying toward a PhD on Old Testament ethics. Beyond pastoral commitments, Mark speaks and writes on the areas of social justice and the mission of the church. His previous career was as a jazz pianist in Sydney and around Australia. Mark is married to Erin and together they have a daughter, Mahla. Erin Goheen Glanville is an independent scholar with a Ph.D. in English and Cultural Studies. Her thesis, "Storied Displacement, Storied Faith," explores fictional narratives of displacement as pedagogical

tools for church-based refugee activism. Most recently she coedited a volume *Countering Displacements: The Creativity and Resilience of Indigenous and Refugee-ed People*, published by University of Alberta Press. Erin's family (partner Mark, daughter Mahla) straddles two continents, relocating last year to Vancouver, Canada from Sydney, Australia. Her greatest delight is creating and working alongside her daughter.

Expect to be **recharged** for ministry as Michael, Mark, and Erin share the plenary talks, open up Scripture each day, and as you interact with colleagues in ministry from all across Australia.
