A BRIEF HISTORY OF CHURCH PLANTING IN THE CRCA

When the early migrants came to Australia they gathered people into communities of faith and established new churches wherever they settled. The result was that many people were saved and churches multiplied. (Article 30 of the Acts of Synod 1952 states, "The churches are encouraged to carry out home missions work among the many unchurched Dutch migrants"). This effort grew the Christian Reformed Churches of Australia to a peak of around 10,000 members in the 1980s

In May 2006 the Synod took the bold step of appointed the Church Planting Taskforce to again encourage and resource local churches to be active in reaching people in new communities with the gospel with a view to planting new churches around the country. It allocated its unused reserves for this work.

Since these decisions were taken four new CRCA churches have been instituted, nine new CRCA churches are in various stags of being planted, and there are half a dozen churches considering planting in the future. There have been also some setbacks, with some church plants struggling and failing, but the Lord is blessing our work and our labour is bearing fruit. This work is happening in every state, and by this work the gospel is going out to more communities, and people are, by God's grace being added to the Kingdom.

The purpose of this campaign is to raise urgently needed funds to support ministry workers who step out in faith to preach the gospel in new places in order to save people and start new communities of grace. Due to Synod's tight financial situation the funds previously earmarked for church planting are no longer available. The funds we raise will enable us to continue to support this exciting work.

NEW COMMUNITIES BEING REACHED WITH THE GOSPEL

Since the 2009 Synod four new CRCA churches instituted
